Maryland PreK Grant

Families who live in Maryland and meet the income eligibility are able to enroll children in PreK at no cost. Please contact Charlene Nichols (admissions@mountaviat.og) to find out what documentation is required to participate in the program. The MD PreK Grant is also available to children entering PreK4.

MAA Families

The new PreK3 program will allow us to enroll a limited number of children who are not part of the Maryland PreK Grant. The openings will offer families who plan to attend Mount Aviat's grade school the option of enrolling a 3-year-old child.

The PreK3 tuition covers all fees, learning materials, and **includes lunch and snacks each day**. The Maryland PreK Grant has specific program requirements. The program must be full-day, 5 days a week. Some requirements increase the cost of operating the program. To offset these costs, the tuition rate for the 3-year-old program is higher than our existing 4-year-old program.

Tuition for PreK3 for those not eligible for the MD PreK grant will be \$7,900.00.

Families who enroll in Mount Aviat Academy must be willing to accept the incurred financial obligations and open a FACTS account. The following guidelines have been established.

1. Families must open an account with FACTS Management, the company contracted by Mount Aviat to manage payments. The cost for this service is as follows:

Pay tuition in full = No charge Semi-annual payments (July and January) = \$10.00/year Quarterly or monthly payments = \$45.00/year

Families who choose to pay the full tuition amount in July need to open a FACTS account so other payments can be made during the year (for example, yearbook).

2. If a student is enrolled as of July 1st, the tuition payments made in July, August, and any month the student attends are nonrefundable, even if the student does not complete the entire month.

3. In any special cases, the Finance Committee will determine what is equitable.
